





Education Plus Health launched a new school-based health center this year at KIPP DuBois Collegiate Academy



Education Plus Health continued on its historic collaborative venture into 2022, launching the SBHC Collaborative with federally qualified health center provider Family Practice & Counseling Network (FPCN). The organizations teamed up to expand the scope and breadth of services offered to students under a federally supported framework for expanded resources overall. The advanced practice registered nurse practitioners leading the school-based health centers are supported by a comprehensive team of school nurse, behavioral health counselors, dentists, and community health workers. Six schools relaunched as the SBHC Collaborative in 2022:

- Vaux Big Picture High School
- CB Community School
- Building 21 High School
- Belmont Charter School
- Belmont High School
- Inquiry Charter School



The SBHC Collaborative launched the school-based health center mobile dental program in 2022 serving 75 students with oral health care.



Education Plus Health strengthened its adolescent substance abuse prevention services using SBIRT with a new partnership with Drexel's Center for Family Intervention Science. This training and program development initiative brought a new platform for universal behavioral screening on a tablet for ease of youth completion and tracking and analysis.



Education Plus Health worked with the Pennsylvania School-Based Health Alliance (PSBHA) to secure a \$2.85 million investment in school-based health centers across the state for their integrative behavioral health work. Both the PSBHA and the Black Doctors Consortium received an historic health equity investment through the COVID-19 Public Health Equity Initiative (PHEI), made possible by State Fiscal Recovery Funds from the American Rescue Plan (ARP).




The Education Plus Health Room2Breathe asthma home visiting program was showcased for their support by the American Lung Association at their 2022 event.



In collaboration with the Philadelphia Department of Public Health serving the pediatric practices at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, Einstein Pediatrics, and Temple Pediatrics, the team of community health workers delivered 100 bags of cleaning and other trigger reduction supplies from the American Lung Association to families in North Philadelphia.



Education Plus Health continued to team up with Diversified Community Services now the Greater Philadelphia Community Alliance, along with I-Lead to bring the Harcum College Associate's Degree Program to South Philadelphia. Congratulations to Diversified who merged with United Communities to form the Greater Philadelphia Community Alliance (GPCA).



Department of Health Secretary and Physician General Dr. Denise Johnson visited the Building 21 School-Based Health Center this winter, her 3rd visit to a Pennsylvania SBHC in the last quarter of 2022. Her visit was joined by Dr. Kendra McDow of the School District of Philadelphia and other health services leaders, representatives from Senator Haywood and Representative Rabb's office, school and health center leaders, and most importantly, two young women with a lot to say about the importance of their school-based health center.
